What defines "success"?



- Success is subjective
- Depends on definition and perspective
- Success criteria varies (entering treatment, completing treatment, etc.)




What factors into success?



- Multiple factors are at play
- Families often seek assurance of success
- Focus on understanding the process over success rates



Success in addiction treatment



- Evolution of definitions for "success"
- Varying opinions
- Harm reduction vs. complete abstinence



Success for families



- The family's goals
- The willingness to accept different outcomes
- Intervention goals beyond substance use



What is the role of an interventionist?



- Educate families on the process
- Help increase likelihood of positive outcomes
- Address what's beyond their control
- Helping families define their success
- Addressing behaviors, not only substance use



What is an intervention?



- It is NOT about controlling your loved one
- Learning to let go
- The family's role



The importance of follow through



- Success linked to following suggested changes
- Misconceptions about AA and other programs
- Importance of commitment to treatment plans



The impact of family recovery



- Healthier families lead to better outcomes
- Long-term success and family follow through
- Overcoming victim mentality, avoiding blame, and embracing accountability
- Recognizing progress over time and past attempts as steps toward success
